Dear Friends in Christ,

Do you enjoy finishing something? Find satisfaction in completing a project? Do you sometimes, while doing something are yearning for the "finish line?" I can't help think and hear in my mind the words "Are we there yet?" There are those times when we simply look forward to things being done.

Of course there are times when we don't want to reach the end of something, especially when it's a vacation or celebration or special journey in life.
