As most of you know, I traveled to Korea (9 days) and Hong Kong (2 days) as a mentor for Korean-American seminary students going on a pilgrimage and immersion trip into their own culture that they wanted and needed to learn more about in order to better serve as a pastor in the church, whether in the Korean or cross-cultural church setting.

We also have freedom from the trappings of sin and temptations. We have freedom in Christ to overcome bad habits and even patterns that have been a part of one's family for generations. We have the freedom in Christ to be changed so we can have more hope, more peace, more forgiveness, more grace, more patience, more perseverance, more self-control, more kindness, more goodness, more mercy, more faith, more compassion, more gentleness, more love, and more of all that God has for us by the power and presence of the Holy Spirit living in and through us.

God gave us the freedom we have in Christ so that in growing and overcoming we may not have something to show for ourselves, but rather be able to have blessed others and brought others closer to Christ and a saving relationship with him. For in doing so we also give the gifts we have been granted in Christ, some of those gifts being the gift of freedom to grow in godliness and love. So let us all use the freedom we have in Christ.
