Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I remember when I was a child and growing up in wonderful Waterford, Michigan where (like in most places around our country at one point) I got up in the summers and thought about my day. It went something like this...Fishing as soon as it's light enough; hang out at my friend's house, have lunch with him if his mom was cool with it (and she made the most wonderful lunches); go for a bike ride or a swim if the weather was hot enough; explore the woods and find new places to checkout; and whatever I felt like doing until it was time to go home for dinner. Those were the days...

Today things are quite different. When my kids go outside to play, especially when they were younger, I would either be out with them or watching from inside the house or a window open to hear them. They know not to approach strangers who pull up in a car and ask for directions or offer candy or anything. To simply get me or Jamie before they go along with anyone they don't know.

Out of all the places I've lived as an adult since I lived in Waterford, Carleton has been the closest thing to my wonderful childhood memories, and a perfect place for our children to grow up in. They can walk to the library across the street, walk or bike to Ash Carleton Park, bike around the neighborhood and play with their friends, and of course walk or bike to the local ice cream parlor! And I do know it's a safe place for me and my family.

Why do I share all of this? I do so since there's a change that in light of bad news in our country that we as a church are taking steps to make it safer for our church members, especially for our children. One thing the Church Council has agreed to do is keep the north doors locked all the time. These are the doors all the way down the hall opposite of the sanctuary and nearest to the fellowship hall. For those of you who typically park at that end, please know that you will have to walk around to the other doors on Sundays to enter the church, unless you have a church key. Just make sure the door remains locked if you do use a key to enter. And for families with young children or those having babies, please park closer to the doors nearest the sanctuary. Those with mobility challenges typically park closest to the sanctuary. However, we want to let everyone know we are going to try this out, and it may be permanent. We will place signs on the doors that will be locked with a notice of when it'll begin, which is on October 7th.

Someone was telling me the other day they never locked their doors, they left the car keys in the car all the time, and crime was almost non-existent where they lived at a certain time. Unfortunately times have changed, and sometimes it can be really inconvenient, just as going through the airport has over the years.

We have prayed, planned, and now are taking steps in keeping the church a bit safer for everyone. It is a perfect plan? No. Can we do better? Sure. But are we doing something about it? Most definitely. So please be patient and understanding as we make some changes. And as with my words in this newsletter and future announcements and notes, we will do our best to let everyone know in advance as we make our church as safe and secure as possible.

The following vaccines may be available to adults 19 years of age or older who are uninsured*, or underinsured* and meet certain risk factors: Td/Tdap, MMR, Hepatitis B, Hepatitis A. Flu and Pneumonia will be available for Medicare part B recipients.

*Adults with vaccine insurance coverage or Medicaid do not qualify for this program.

NO APPOINTMENT NECESSARY – MINORS MUST HAVE PARENT OR LEGAL GUARDIAN'S SIGNATURE
ALL HEALTH CHECK SITES WILL OFFER THE FOLLOWING FREE TESTS AND SERVICES:

Blood Pressure • Nutrition and Medication Counseling • Height/Weight Measurement

THE FOLLOWING TESTS WILL BE AVAILABLE FOR A SMALL FEE:

ACCURATE RESULTS FOR SOME BLOOD TESTS REQUIRE FASTING FOR 12 HOURS. TAKE ALL MEDICATION WITH WATER ONLY.

BLOOD PANEL—\$20 A 22-test profile that includes a complete blood cell count, liver, kidney and thyroid function, glucose, sodium, potassium, cholesterol, triglycerides, HDL, and LDL.

HA1C—\$15 A blood test that aids in diagnosing and in monitoring diabetes.

VITAMIN D—\$10 Measures how much vitamin D is in your body. **Vitamin D** is essential for healthy bones, and a lack of it can lead to health problems, including cardiovascular disease.

COLORECTAL CANCER KITS—\$5 These are take home kits that may detect early warning signs of ulcers, cancer or colitis
