Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

"...From everyone to whom much as been given, much will be required..."
- Luke 12:48

I was reminded of this verse when I watched a Spider-Man movie a while back when Peter Parker's grandfather said to Peter, "With great power comes great responsibility."

Along the lines of this thought is one that has been a part of my life since I had become a pastor and witnessed the blessings and joys of life, as well as the trials and griefs. That other thought, and I would say one of the outstanding themes in my life, is to make the most of the time and life God has given to us. The 15th and 16th verses from Ephesians, chapter 5, speak to this quite well. "Be careful then how you live, not as unwise people but as wise, making the most of the time..."

When I look at my wife and three children, I am filled with such great joy and definitely want to make the most of every moment. And when I read of, witness, or have close friends and family experience loss of any kind, I am not only heart-broken and grief-stricken with them, but also reminded of the time we have, the gifts we have, and the relationships we have and to cherish. The night prior to me writing this, Jamie and I went to a visitation for one of Jamie's friends who suffered a terrible loss of her sister and her sister's entire family that included her husband and three children. The five of them all died in a very tragic car accident when another car driving the wrong way on the freeway at 2:30 in the morning hit them head-on. They were driving back from a family trip. It was confirmed that the other driver who hit them was drunk. No doubt this has shaken the entire community surrounding this family.

This not only brings our spirits very low and leads us to think about having no idea when we will be called home, we no doubt are also tempted to live by constant fear and anxiousness. However, this is not what such events should ultimately lead us to, that is to live by fear. Rather we should feel God's Holy Spirit reminding us of how we are to live a life of love for Him and others; to make the most of the time God has granted us, not knowing how much time we have; to live a wise life in seeking God's will and God's kingdom first in everything and every relationship; and to know that with all God has granted us in life that there is great responsibility, as well as a day on which we will give an account to our Creator, Lord, and Savior of the life He granted us and how we used it. Though this may bring some worries, it truly shouldn't. We should have a healthy respect and godly appreciation for life and what will come, knowing we are safe and secure Him and his saving grace and forgiveness.

In light of all that can bring us down and cause us to live by fear, let us remember that Christ is always with us by living within us by his very spirit so that we can live by faith (not by fear), and with his hope, peace, joy, and love!




