Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

God has given you a secure future in heaven one day through the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ. So live this life joyfully and freely as an expression of love in everything you think, say, and do so that all those around you and those whom God has allowed to cross your path will be drawn closer to Jesus Christ, our Good Lord and Shepherd!

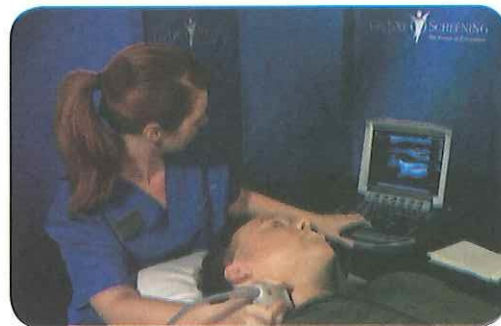
