A WORD FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Disciples of Christ,

We journey again through Lent, having begun with Ash Wednesday on February 17th. Last year we had Ash Wednesday service at church just before we had to go to online worship services, which was on March 15, 2020. It's amazing to think

it has been that long. It's also hard to remember that we had in-person worship services when things seemed to be better with the pandemic, having worshiped in the sanctuary from June 28 to November 8, 2020. Having resumed in-person services on February 21, we pray COVID cases in Monroe County and our area continue to drop, especially with more and more people receiving the vaccine.

As we journey through Lent, looking forward to celebrating Easter on April 4, be intentional about doing what Christ did well when things were overwhelming, when people were asking and even demanding more and more from him, when his purpose and the ongoing needs of those around him were seemingly at odds, and when he was tired and even in anguish. Christ took time to be alone. Christ took time by himself to pray. Christ took time for his own renewal and restrengthening. Christ took time not only to be his best for others, but first and foremost to be close to God the Father and God the Holy Spirit. Jesus also did at times rest with his disciples, even falling asleep on the boat that ended up being tossed and battered in a storm which Jesus calmed down after being woken up. I'd like to imagine that Jesus then went right back to sleep. And Jesus also took some of his closest friends/disciples with him when he wanted company as he was preparing and wrestling with going to the cross to die for our sins and all that entailed with taking on our sins, being temporarily separated from God the Father and God the Holy Spirit when he went to hell in our place.

So, if Jesus, though God who became human in order to save us, needed to take time to get away and for rest, not only physically but also spiritually, let us all make sure to do so, especially during Lent. Draw even closer to God than you have before. In any relationship, it is possible to draw closer or father apart, even if you've known each other your entire lives. How well we walk in life directly relates to how well we walk with God, how closely we walk with Jesus Christ, and how in-step we are with God's Holy Spirit.

May you daily take up your cross and follow Jesus so that you may not only know the joy of living for God every day, in everything and every relationship, but that you may also know the loving, strengthening and renewing relationship you can continuously have when walking closely with God.

Dear Church Family,

Mike and I would like to thank everyone for your prayers. Mike's right eye is still in the healing process. They say this is very common in near sighted people, that the retina tears over time, but has to be dealt with immediately. My bone scan (first one in 7 years) since my diagnosis of breast cancer was clear of cancer to the bones, showing instead, osteoarthritis to the spine, lumbar, knees, and feet, some of which is a side effect of the drug I take as a cancer preventive.

My mom, had her first elder dose of chemo last Monday and seems to be taking it well so far, she will continue with treatment, every three weeks. They did however find a mass in her breast; this latest finding may complicate things. Continued prayers for her, my best example of a true warrior.

Taek Kim, to thank him for his years of faithful service as we pray God's blessing upon

Rev. Cloud Poy

Cloud (Eun Sik Poy) went to the Philippines on a short-term mission while studying Theology at the Central Theological School in Seoul, Korea. He then answered a call to pastoral ministry and decided to do higher theological education and moved to the United States.

He studied Theology at God's Bible School in Cincinnati, Ohio, for his Bachelor's degree. He then went to Asbury Seminary to study missiology; however, he transferred from missiology to Master of Divinity because he believed that would be the groundwork for mission work. After graduation, he was commissioned by the United Methodist Church as a pastor, and he is now working in at a church in Northern Michigan.

Rev. Cloud is interested in Multi-Ethnic ministry based on his concern as a Korean pastor at American churches. He is currently studying for his doctorate degree (D. Min) at Talbot School of Theology at Biola University in California.

It was while he was praying for a holistic care center for pastoral workers, that he met his wife, Lisa, who has the same vision for "the care center for pastors and missionaries." Both of us pray for the ministry of care for the soul.

Lisa Hwang Poy (Korean name: Kyungsuk)

Lisa majored in Mission English (B.A.) at Seoul Theological University. She then graduated from the same school majoring in Christian Counseling (M.A.C.). During her graduate school study, she served as an unordained pastor at the Korean Coast Guard for three years, leading Friday and Sunday worship for the police officers.

After her ministry at the Korean Coast Guard, she served in a newly planted church located in Doksan-dong, Seoul, as a lay minister. At the same time, she worked in marketing for a Christian Broadcasting Company (now called Good T.V.). After working for about a year, God called her to serve O.M.S. (One Mission Society), a mission agency; she worked there for thirteen years.

While working as an office manager, Lisa taught English to missionary candidates at the Evangelical Missionary Training Center in the Korea Evangelical Holiness Church. She built up a relationship with homeland assignment missionaries, who stayed at the training center. It was a challenge for her to have a concern about missionary member care, naturally, because she could hear missionaries' real life and anxiety at the mission field. She earned a Th.D. in "Self-Expressive Writing Therapy for Missionary (Spiritual Guidance for Missionaries)" at the specialized graduate school of divinity.

In August of 2018, she went to Asbury Seminary in Wilmore, Kentucky, for her second doctoral program (D.Min). She felt that God gave her the heart to start a member care ministry in the United States. A few days later, she met her husband, Cloud, and in December of that year, she married him and moved to the States.

Lisa has already finished the missionary training at O.M.S. H.Q. in Greenwood, Indiana. At the same time, she completed the associate missionary training at the Korea Evangelical Holiness Church. Hence, she was in the process of funding for member care ministry. Marriage was a new chapter in her life, and her ministry field changed from Korea to the States. Now she is in a transition period to adjust to the new area.
