PASTOR'S THOUGHTS

Dear Friends in Christ,

During these past 3+ months, I have experienced what many of you have been experiencing, which I have called pandemic fatigue. I am not complaining, but more coming to a realization that we are all in one way or another, in varying degrees, and with varying circumstances are feeling the effects of doing what we can to help with the stopping of the spreading of COVID-19. And thank God that so far we have done a good job because our state is one of the three states that is on track in containing the virus. And though restrictions have lifted and as many people enjoy the lifting of restrictions, we pray and hope that in light of people relaxing more that we still stay vigilant so we continue the trend of containing and lowering the cases of COVID-19.

Let me know if you are interested in giving your time freely to the ministry of our church as we create worship services that bring each other closer to God and reach those who cannot attend inperson services now and in the future.

Finally, I thank God for all who have done the vital ministry of running the sound and slideshows on Sundays, for those who have recorded songs, children's messages, and other parts of the worship service such as the words of welcome and prayers. Most do not know what seems like a simple video sometimes takes a lot more time and effort.

Thank God that we are able to do it as well as have. May God help us continue doing so, and even better, as we do so with more joy and help.

Hello Church Families!

We finally get to come back to church! Things will be a bit different and it will be a good idea to prep your children - especially the younger ones to let them know what to expect. They will see people in masks, some pews will be taped off, we won't have hymnals or Bibles, and we won't be singing or greeting with hugs and handshakes. But we'll be back together!

Although it's not feasible to hold Junior Church or open the nursery at this point, children of all ages are always welcome in the sanctuary! Although having children beside you in church is not the same worship experience, it is an excellent chance for them to learn by watching you! Here are some ideas to help not just occupy them in the pews, but to engage them in worship as well.

1. Look Ahead. We will be getting the bulletin through email a few days before worship. Help older children bookmark the verse in their Bible ahead of time. If it is a story, help younger children bookmark the story in a Children's Bible. Look for key words like love, or hope and have children listen for that word.

2. Whisper and Coach. Children are still learning about all the parts of worship. Call attention to what's next in easy to grasp words, "it's time to say thank you to God". Encourage them to participate...give them a heads up on the response for the call to worship. Suggest what to listen for, "Everyone is hungry in this story, I wonder what Jesus will do?" Share your love of worship, "this is my favorite verse/song...". Check out the blog Worshiping with Children for more ideas - under the topical index.

3. Pack a Worship Bag. While children are always learning, there are already many parts of the service they can participate in...and there are other where tools can help them focus. Here are some suggestions to start...

- Age appropriate Bible
- Spiral Notebook
- Pencils and crayons

4. Grab a "Welcome Back Pack".

Bags will be waiting for the children when they return to church. The things inside are gifts to add to their worship bag. Depending on your child's age, you will find.

- Pipe Cleaners (to fidget with, or make objects/people to go with the Bible story)
- Sensory Bottles
- A Prayer Finger Labyrinth or a Sanctuary I Spy game
- Fidgets to occupy hands while eyes, ears, and minds are taking in the service.

(Extra notebooks and crayons to take will be also available if you don't have them!)
