

The Apostle James' Theory of Faith and Action

I want to share the ministry motto of the Apostle James, who is regarded as one of the prominent pastors of the Jerusalem Church. James emphasized that the focus of his ministry was to translate Christian faith into action. His theory was an action-oriented Christian faith rooted in trust in God. He said Christian faith should be manifested in practical actions to benefit those in need. In essence, James stressed that the Christian faith ought to be actively practiced in the life of Christians rather than being a mere intellectual agreement with the teachings of Jesus Christ.

As a pastor at Carleton United Methodist Church, I wholeheartedly support putting Christian faith into action, and I believe that genuine Christian faith, rooted in trust in God, should be expressed in practical action.

Ministry Campaigns In 2023

Carleton United Methodist Church's primary ministry focus for 2023 included four campaigns to reconnect individuals with a deep spiritual relationship with God and foster a strong sense of community.

Worshiping Community: Carleton UMC is a local faith community, resembling a close-knit family, bound by love and care, offering words of encouragement. We gather to worship God and serve people.

Bible Reading Church: Engaging with the 365 Bible will nourish your soul with the Word of God and guide you toward a healthy Christian spiritual life. we encourage people to read 3 chapters a day. Additionally, we invite them to attend an intensive 2-hour Bible reading class every Monday.

Prayerful Church: We extend a warm invitation to prayer warriors to join us for a prayer fellowship every Wednesday at the church. Together, we seek to experience the workings of the Holy Spirit during our prayer time.

Invitation to Reconnect with the Church: The Member Care team sends cards to individuals who have become disconnected, encouraging them to rejoin our faith community.

These are Bible-based campaigns that emphasize Christian faith in action. We plan to continue these biblical campaigns in 2024


Telling the Stories

FROM THE FINANCE COMMITTEE:

Attached is the General Fund Income and Expense Summary as of October 15, 2023. As you can see the general fund is in the deficit by \$4,416. We are still running behind in paying our Ministry Shares, and hope that we are able to catch up by the end of the year. Typically November and December are fairly good months for contributions. Hopefully, if contributions this year are good, we should come close to breaking even for 2023. We will continue keeping a tight control on spending, and pray that contributions will catch up by the end of the year.
