

We are approaching the seasons of Thanksgiving, Advent, and Christmas. These are the seasons God has placed into our life cycle to remember that God is the Provider, Sustainer, and Redeemer of our lives. These seasons also remind us that we are blessed to bless others.

I am so glad that several of our ministry and mission committees are planning to reveal who we are as God's blessed and compassionate community. There may be committees that need our prayers, helping hands, financial support, and warm smiles and presence. Let us do what we can do according to the heart God is giving to us.

My prayer for this new season is this: "God, as the sky is clear, let our neighbors see your compassion in and through us. God, as the fields yield your bounty, help us to be saturated with your generous hearts. We want to be your messenger of kindness and abundance during this season."


