The Thursday of Holy Week is given a particular name – Maundy Thursday. Although its exact origins are unclear, some believe the Maundy derived from the Latin word *mandatum*, which means “command”. On Maundy Thursday we remember the new command Jesus gave to his disciples, to love one another. Others say it stems from the Latin *mundo* meaning wash, recalling how Jesus washed the disciple's feet at the Last Supper (John 13:3- 20).
